As I reflect on 2021, I am humbled and grateful to God for His goodness to Cedarville University. We were able to start the fall semester with a "return to normal"; it was a joy to see students' smiling faces at Getting Started once again and watch them share laughter and hugs with friends. You could visibly see that these days matter to each of these students. God moved during Fall Bible Conference, as we had several professions of faith and other decisions to commit lives to Christ. Throughout the semester God continued to transform the hearts and minds of our students to be more like Christ. Every student on this campus matters to us and to God. This academic year we have been walking through selected parables of Jesus from Matthew and Luke. We're being encouraged to have ears to hear, hearts that receive, and lives that obey. Jesus has much to say to us if we only listen.

We have another record enrollment, the second-largest freshman class ever, a new residence hall under construction, as well as an academic and athletic expansion. The Lord also graciously allowed us to be debt-free as an institution for likely the first time in our history. Finally, we were excited to officially launch One Thousand Days Transformed: The Campaign for Cedarville, a \$125 million fundraising effort that will expand our capacity, increase affordability, transform students' lives in and out of the classroom, and provide for future sustainability. Every gift mattered in making these accomplishments possible for the glory of God.



Undergraduate students spend approximately 1,000 days on Cedarville's campus. Those days go by quickly; ask any senior who is approaching graduation in a few short months. We are determined to make every one of those days count and steward all that God has entrusted to us.

For the 15th-consecutive year, we experienced a record enrollment. More than 1,000 new students joined the Cedarville family. We recognize this as a blessing from the Lord, and we are grateful and humbled by the opportunity to invest in these students' lives.



To continue addressing the needs of this expanding enrollment, in 2021 we began construction on the Athletic and Academic Expansion of Callan Athletic Center and a new women's residence hall, which will help meet the demands of both our growing student body and our increasing number of in-demand graduate programs. Each of these facilities are planned to be open for the fall 2022 semester.



The new addition to Callan will house classrooms, labs, and faculty offices for our new Master of Athletic Training and PA* programs, as well as a new weight room and team room for our student-athletes.



The new residence hall will provide beds for 120 female students, as well as lounge areas for group interaction and building community.



My time in Cedarville so far has been characterized by growth. Academically, I've been stretched to meet the high demands of my classes and spiritually, I've been surrounded by the encouragement and challenge of truth.

Even with COVID-19 restrictions in place, our Global Outreach office sent teams of students across the country and around the world during summer 2021 to minister to others and share the message of the Gospel.

In addition, this year an anonymous donor established a \$1 million endowment for Global Outreach. These funds will make it possible for faculty and staff to lead future missions trips and encourage more students to participate in global ministry opportunities.

Over the last 21 years, I have been impressed by our students. They may not realize it, but they continually challenge me in my spiritual journey. I have had the privilege of watching students as they struggle with issues of faith, asking sincere questions as they seek to make their faith their own.

I let students know that my door is always open. Sometimes they need a shoulder to cry on and a momma's hug, or sometimes they need lots of nudging to get moving in the right direction. Often, students just need a listening ear ... and a safe place to talk through things. Every meeting ends with one question: "What are you thankful for?" Charles and Anita Petersen established their first scholarship at Cedarville – the World Missions Scholarship – in 2003 to help students prepare for and eventually enter the mission field. "We heard a speaker say that many young people wanted to be missionaries but graduated with debt that kept them from getting on the field," they shared. "Or some had so much debt that they never made it to the field."



That same thinking led them to go on to establish three more scholarships at Cedarville: Christian Education, Pastoral Studies, and World Missions - Civil Engineering. They've purposely chosen full-time ministry fields or fields

where starting salaries are low, making debt harder to retire. They added civil engineering most recently due to its potential to help missionaries enter typically closed countries.

Each October and January, Charles and Anita visit campus and have dinner with the most recent recipients of their scholarships. They are blessed to hear how the scholarships have made such a large impact on the students, many of whom share how they would not be at Cedarville without the Petersens' scholarship.

Charles and Anita continue to be strong supporters of Cedarville and its mission, and they encourage others to join them in giving to scholarships. "The Church needs young men and women in our culture, whether as missionaries in their workplace or in some foreign country," they explained. "Cedarville has the tools to produce young men and women who are strong in the Christian faith and also perform at a high level in whatever professional field they choose."

The Petersens consider scholarships the gift that keeps on giving. "Giving to Cedarville is one of the best investments you could make," they said. "It is a great joy to help develop young men and women into strong disciples who bring light into the darkness wherever God may lead them."




My Cedarville experience and the transformative work of Christ in my life since being here is because of the incredible generosity of donors who love God and want to join in the work that God is doing at Cedarville.




