

#### Rules

- 1. Participants must keep their video cameras on during the entire tournament. Competitors will not be able to use the internet or other aids to answer questions. Teams found to be using external aids will be penalized two points for the question.
- 2. Each chapter has selected a team leader who will be in charge of providing the answer to the quizmaster.
- 3. After a question is asked each team will be sent to a Zoom breakout session where they have 60 seconds to discuss the answer with their team.
- 4. When everyone returns to the main session, the team leader will privately chat their answer to the quizmaster. They will then announce their answer when prompted.
- 5. Each team that answers the question correctly will receive a point and those who answer incorrectly will receive zero points for that question. No points will be deducted for wrong answers.
- 6. Questions tonight will be from the following categories: AUB, Lebanon, History, Science, Sports, Pop Culture.
- 7. If two or more teams are tied, then the game will go into a tie break round. The team to best answer the tiebreak question will be named the winner of the round.
- 8. The winner of this round will face the winners from Groups A and C in the final round on June 2nd.
