ARIANNA KELLUM, A JUNIOR FROM COLUMBUS, OHIO, KNEW SHE WANTED TO GO FAR FROM HOME FOR COLLEGE TO CHALLENGE HERSELF. HOWEVER, FUNDING FOR HER FUTURE SOON BECAME A PRINCIPLE CONCERN FOR KELLUM AND HER FAMILY.

"I did not get a full scholarship when I came to UA, so my family and I have had to take out lots of loans," Arianna said. "Being an involved nursing student, it's very difficult to find a job that's flexible."

The financial strain made it challenging for Arianna to truly enjoy her UA experience at first.

Determined to succeed, Arianna was awarded the Betty Johnson Snell Scholarship, lightening the cost burden of books and lab fees. With fewer financial constraints, Arianna became an active member in the Blackburn Institute, a civic engagement organization that fosters leadership skills among its students.

"I was really drawn to the fact that people wanted to help the community and wanted to better the state," she said. "I love Blackburn's mission and meeting people from different backgrounds, of different ages and with different interests."

The Blackburn Institute, where she is currently a chairperson for the 2020 class, fueled Arianna's desire to champion for people within the state of Alabama. Following several on-site service visits to clinics in rural Alabama, Arianna now hopes to transform and improve the health care standard of these struggling communities, specifically in Spanish-speaking areas.



"I minored in Spanish so I would love to bridge the gap between those communities in order to give people the health care they really need and deserve," she said.

Following her anticipated graduation in 2022, Arianna's ambition is to continue travel nursing around the United States to gain as much knowledge and experience with industry-leading technologies and practices as she can.

"We can all learn from each other, because everybody is doing something different to maintain their clinics," Arianna said. "I would love to get my practitioner license and open a clinic in a rural area or an area where there's not as many Spanish-speaking health care professionals."

Without the financial provision of the Betty Johnson Snell Scholarship, Arianna may not have risen to the heights of accomplishment for which UA students are known. Scholarships, fellowships and other programming allow students such as Arianna to achieve their aspirations of excellence and leadership at The University of Alabama. Providing donor-funded scholarships and fellowships to more students allow us to recruit and retain students who will go on to improve the world around them.

Research and endowed faculty positions reinforce the University's rise to prominence as a world-class leader in higher education. A thought-provoking conversation with an engaged adviser while walking across the Quad and long hours spent searching for the answer together provide the mentoring relationships necessary to lead the discovery of transformational truths and technologies. Proud to be named a "Very High Research Activity" institution by the Carnegie Commission on Higher Education, The University of Alabama continues to launch bold ideas for transdisciplinary research that profoundly impact the state of Alabama, the nation and the world around us. Through the support of this Campaign, the University will advance its standing as a premier comprehensive research institution over the next five years, translating research productivity and innovation into economic and societal development.

While The University of Alabama has experienced marked growth in a number of areas, faculty endowments lag behind our peers. Increasing our endowed chairs and professorships provides a distinct advantage to our already prestigious status—it streamlines the path to attract and retain the type of top talent that drives learning both in and outside of the classroom.

UA will take an aggressive stance in the race for top faculty by adding 75 new faculty endowments through The Rising Tide.

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KEYHAN GAVAHI, A SECOND-YEAR PHD CANDIDATE ORIGINALLY FROM IRAN, WAS SO DETERMINED ON WORKING WITH DR. HAMID MORADKHANI THAT HE DELAYED STARTING HIS DEGREE FOR AN ENTIRE YEAR TO SEE IF A POSITION WOULD BECOME AVAILABLE.

In 2017, Hamid was working at Portland State University, but by the new year, he found himself as the Alton N. Scott Endowed Chair in the department of civil, construction and environmental engineering.

"He told me that he was going to join UA's faculty," Keyhan said, "but I didn't know anything about UA. I started to do some research about The University of Alabama, and I remember opening the web page for research. The amount of support UA had for research was incredible, as was the support it provides for its students and faculty, not just financially, but also by inspiring their students to act upon their innovative ideas."

Just one year after Hamid's arrival on campus in January 2018, Keyhan was also at the University.

"Dr. Moradkhani is very supportive," Keyhan said. "He helps you a lot during the research. He always tells us not to give up, and if we think something is right or we can work on it and do it better, he always gives us the confidence to do that."

Keyhan is one of several UA students who currently works alongside Hamid studying drought environments across the continental United States.

"He's very knowledgeable in his field; he's truly an expert," Keyhan said. "The insight he gives to us is very valuable."



Hamid's team is utilizing leading-edge technologies to predict and monitor drought conditions in order to mitigate economic risk and loss, particularly in the agricultural and public health industries.

"One of the crucial resources I'm currently using is The University of Alabama's high-performance computing center," Keyhan said. "I think it is one of the best high-performance computing centers in the nation. The amount of data that we are processing sometimes surpasses 30 terabytes, and we need tools to analyze this data."

When their team is not crunching numbers or transforming the landscape of water technology, Hamid's influence frequently extends beyond the classroom.

"As a mentor, he cares for us a lot," Keyhan said. "He wants to know if we are doing well in life. Especially during the pandemic, he was always supportive by checking on us through email or calling us."

Keyhan, who is planning on completing his PhD in 2023, said he doesn't have any concrete plans so early in his program, but would like to remain a researcher focusing on drought and other natural disasters, such as hurricanes.

"Hopefully, one day I may also become a faculty member, who knows!"

Whether our students are taking to the stage in the new Performing Arts Academic Center, to the community workspace in The Cube or to the field of Bryant-Denny Stadium, cutting-edge facilities elevate each facet of the UA experience. The University's labs, studios and classrooms provide the greatest collection of industry-leading tools and technologies, granting the space for creative innovation that drives our research standing and winning school rankings. These spaces offer more than a backdrop for learning; they are the canvas where knowledge and innovation thrive.

The success of the Hewson Hall Building Campaign is a prime example of what we can accomplish through the generosity and steadfastness of our donors. The campaign exceeded its goal of \$30 million committed for the project within an accelerated timeframe of just over a year. And this effort will pay significant dividends. With 22 classrooms, 31 team collaboration rooms and ample conference rooms and gathering spaces, this dynamic facility is a transformative addition to the Culverhouse College of Business—it is a gathering place that allows students the space to create and collaborate and faculty the room to conduct innovative research. The Rising Tide will impact more than 500,000 square feet of space across cam thus perpetuating the wave of tradition a excellence in the UA experience.

FOR SULLIVAN IRVINE, A SOPHOMORE FROM MOBILE, ALABAMA, ATTENDING THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA HAS BECOME A FAMILY TRADITION.

"My brother was here, my dad went here," Sullivan said. "I was looking at other colleges, including some Ivy League schools, but when I came to Alabama, I just had a great feeling about it."

Part of the draw for Sullivan was UA's prestigious Culverhouse College of Business.

"I've always loved business," he said. "The business school provided more opportunities than any of the other colleges I toured."

One of the most recent and transformative opportunities for the business school is the construction of Hewson Hall. With dozens of new classrooms, team collaboration rooms and conference rooms, Hewson Hall will provide students with the spaces they need to position themselves at the top of learning and career prospects.

Sullivan said that currently, there aren't many large classrooms to accommodate team collaboration in Alston or Bidgood Halls.

"Twenty-two extra classrooms will help the students within the business school tremendously," he said.

Furthermore, limited space to work together has been an additional challenge for students during the coronavirus pandemic.



"With social distancing, it's hard to collaborate with anybody in terms of student-on-student communication or with academic studies," Sullivan said. "For one of my classes, we had to have a real estate contract negotiation in a Zoom breakout room. It ended up taking three-and-a-half hours because we couldn't meet in person."

Sullivan, who serves as a Culverhouse Ambassador and a senator for the business school in the Student Government Association, said his campus involvement has allowed him to team up with other students across campus.

"I like the ability to have influence on campus to make UA better for myself and all those around me," he said.

Upon his anticipated graduation in May 2023, Sullivan hopes to work in investment banking or asset management.

"That's the focus right now, so I'm trying to lay the foundation to make those goals possible," he said.

MONTANA FOUTS, A PITCHER FROM GRAYSON, KENTUCKY, WAS ONLY 14 YEARS OLD WHEN SHE COMMITTED TO PLAY SOFTBALL AT THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA.

"Alabama was my last school to visit," Montana said. "After UA, I decided not to tour any more campuses. It was a feeling of being here, seeing the team with each other and the person-over-athlete mindset that made the difference."

Montana grew up on the softball field with her father, watching him play from her perch in his bat bag in the dugout. Now, she feels just as at home on campus as she does on the ballfields in Kentucky.

"I go back for breaks, and I come back to another home,"

Montana said. "They care about you as a person here, and I
think that's what shapes me."

An integral component of UA's winning atmosphere for the two-time All-American and 2021 NFCA Pitcher of the Year is Rhoads Stadium, which underwent a \$3 million renovation in 2019 as part of The Crimson Standard portion of the Capital Campaign. The First Base Plaza was expanded and new concession stands, restrooms and ticket windows were added to improve the game-day experience for the more than 3,000 fans who regularly pack Rhoads Stadium. Additionally, the team's locker room and clubhouse were renovated and a third pitching lane was added to the bullpen.



"We've got quite a few pitchers, and we do a lot of work in the bullpens," Montana said. "Having a third pitching lane is allowing us more time to practice. My success is built on the work we put in and the time we spend up there."

The clubhouse is a frequent gathering spot for Montana and her teammates.

"We were up there all the time," Montana said. "We'd be up there studying until 11:00 at night and be back at 8:00 the next morning, eating together and hanging out."

Montana, who led her team to an SEC Tournament Championship and Women's College World Series appearance in 2021, is expected to graduate in December 2021 with a bachelor's in psychology and a minor in sport management. She will begin her graduate studies in Spring 2022. She would love to continue playing softball and hopes to earn a place on the Team USA roster. In the meantime, she plans to remain at the University to pursue a master's degree while continuing to teach softball camps.

"Everyone at UA is so willing to help in every situation," Montana said. "Your goals come first. I'm really thankful for everybody who made the renovations possible. We love being in our new space, and our fans love it. It means a lot to us to make them happy."
