the most competitive undergraduate award in the sciences. We also are ranked second among Division III institutions for producing NCAA Postgraduate Scholars.

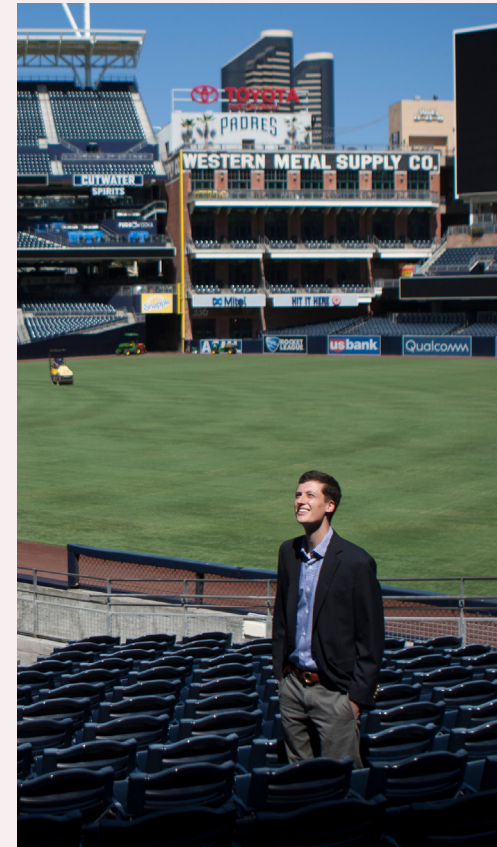
